UNIFORM REMINDERS

We appreciate your support with this. We are preparing pupils for the very strict uniform expectations they will encounter when they go to secondary school.

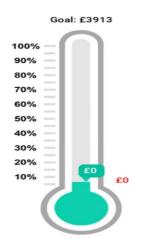
Caldecote School children need a new stage! Help the PTA to fundraise....

Hooray for the sunshine! As we move into the summer term, it's the perfect time to refresh our minds and focus on our wellbeing and boost our self-esteem.

Self-esteem means the way we think and feel about ourselves. When we have good or high self-esteem, we: feel good about who we are most of the time, believe in ourselves, and our qualities and strengths, believe we are worthy and deserving of all the good things in life, including love, kind friends and fun experiences. Having a good self-esteem is not about being happy all the time, or always feeling confident. We all have bad days sometimes which may include negative thoughts. But having a good self-esteem, means we're more able to move on from these feelings by being kind to ourselves and asking for support. To boost your self-esteem, you need to identify the negative beliefs you have about yourself, then challenge them. Recognise the things you are good at, build positive relationships, be kind to yourself, learn to be assertive and start saying 'NO'.

Orange Class have kicked off the Summer Term with a new seating arrangement, a pebble jar treat and of course the new topic 'Mighty Monarchs'! In English the children are learning about playscripts with Mrs Smart and Autobiographies with Mrs Duncombe. We have enjoyed reading biographies about famous people and noting down their achievements in chronological order ready to turn them into autobiographies. In Maths the children are learning about place value and telling the time. We have started using Microsoft Publisher in Computing and reading staff notation in Music. The children are enjoying our new class book 'The Royal Rabbits of London'.

Summer term has started brilliantly in Yellow Class. The class have been very engaged with our new topic - The Great Fire of London'. Pupils have learnt about how the fire started, reasons for it spreading and looked at the timeline of events. This history work is supporting our English writing. Pupils are learning how to write a newspaper article and a diary entry. In maths we have continued to look at fractions. Our PSHE topic this half term explores how we stay healthy. We have explored what the word healthy means to us and the different ways we can achieve this. We have focused this week on food groups.

Purple Class have had a good return to class after the Easter break. One of the new experiences of this term, is the time to go swimming each week. Purple Class have been taking a coach to swimming lessons each week where they will continue to develop their swimming skills for the rest of the half term. We have started our new book, Cogheart, and begun learning about our new history topic: the Industrial Revolution. In English, we are learning how to write film scripts. We have learnt about scene headings and how to set out the dialogue and action lines for a script. In maths, we have been solving multi-step problems using all our operations. This has really challenged us to work systematically and read the questions carefully. Well done for your hard work this week Purple Class.

Red Class have made a great start to their new topic! They have been listening to stories set on the farm and enjoyed retelling the story of Farmer Duck and describing how the characters behaved and felt. In maths, the focus has been on subtracting and the children have been using a number line and explaining their workings.

They have also been out in the school grounds looking for changes with the passing seasons. They have made mixed media pictures of trees and taken a photo using the iPad.

Blue Class have been very enthusiastic about their new topic 'Africa'. In English, we are learning the features of a non-chronological report ready to write our own about a lion. In maths, we have been practicing numbers to 100 as well as exploring what halves and quarters are. In computing, we have used the laptops to type sentences and learn about word processing. In PSHE, we have been thinking about where money comes from.

Green class have been getting into their new topic of 'Nibbler's and Nashers' by finding out how the digestive system works. We have just embarked upon reading David Walliam's book 'The Demon Dentist' and hope that visits to the dentist are not really like Walliam's has portrayed! It is that TIME of year where we think about the clock and interestingly, everyone is very confident about what time break and lunchtime are! We are very much looking forward to making our own healthy, seasonal pizzas in design technology so watch out Dominoes pizza!

Some very usual animals that were 'sighted' this week in Silver Class. Newspapers explained the details of this sighting and, at times, I feared for my life that such a dangerous creature could be roaming our land! The class should be exceptionally proud of the progress they have made; it was a pleasure to read all of their writing. The class are looking forward to writing stories about the adventures their animal will get up to. 'Painting with scissors' produced some fantastic work this week; we focused on positive and negative shapes and used these in our collage. In R.E, the Humanism was introduced and PSHCE is focusing on transitions ready for secondary school. We have had our residential schedule through this week and the class are excited to hear about the activities they will be doing such as raft building and high ropes. We've also had our mock SATs this week and the class feel confident and at ease with the 'set up' of each day. Some even said that were excited for it!

Education Inclusion Family Advisor County Wide Online Workshops

The Education Inclusion Family Advisor team offers a range of countywide online workshops. We welcome any parent/carer with a child/ren in primary schools.

Getting it right for the Children Session 1- Tuesday 23 April, 12:13:30; session 2 Tuesday 30 April, 12:00-13:30

The workshop is for parents who are separated or in the process of separating from their child's other parent and who are finding it difficult to communicate with one another, it is designed to help parents to manage separation in ways that will be less harmful to their children. Parents will learn ways to improve their communication and negotiation skills to work better with their child's other parent. Parents should attend both sessions.

Sibling Rivalry - Tuesday 7 May, 12:00-13:00

During the workshop we will be exploring the range of feelings that exist between siblings and the needs a child has from its parents and carers in relation to his/her siblings; learning about the factors that can affect sibling relationships and lead to rivalries developing. We will consider the range of behaviours that can be observed between siblings who are not getting on and the role of parents and carers in managing these behaviours. We will spend time covering strategies and think about techniques that will work with all ages but also share those that might be targeted at certain age groups.

What to do when kids push your buttons - Tuesday 14 May, 12:00 - 13:00

During the workshop we will be exploring strategies for parents to remain calm during challenging situations, understand what happens when children get angry and how to help the children develop self-regulation of emotions.

Managing challenging behaviour – Tuesday 21 May, 12:00-13:00

During the workshop we will be exploring what the reasons behind challenging behaviour and supporting parent to understand the reasons behind the behaviour as well as offering strategies for managing situations in a positive way.
